Steve Burge

For his services to schools table tennis as well as in Cleveland.

Played table tennis at school at Ifield in Crawley and then for Hull University.

Became more involved with the game having qualified as a teacher, setting up a table tennis club at the North School in Ashford, Kent, and qualifying as a coach.

In 1988, Steve moved to Billingham and started teaching at Northfield school. Having set up a school club, this blossomed and the sport rivalled football as the main sport in the school.

With the help of various grants, the club was able to buy equipment and many teams were entered into the Stockton & District League - for which he is now secretary.

In 1999 Northfield became a sports college with a focus on table tennis and an old boiler house was converted into a table tennis hall which is still in use today.

The school also hosted county, area and regional rounds of the National schools team competition. Because of this, Steve worked with what was then the English Schools Table Tennis Association (ESTTA) committee.



Northfield school became three times national schools champions with another nine teams becoming national finalists.

After the merger of ESTTA with Table Tennis England, he has continued to work on the schools committee firstly as international co-ordinator and more recently as chairman.

Karenza Mathews

For her services as an English international including as a European medallist.

Karenza played for England at junior level and more than 230 times as a senior.

She represented England many times, playing in Russia and many other European and Iron Curtain countries, as well as in the Far East, including Japan and China, and also in India and Australia.

During her career, Karenza was England No 1 and Women's Singles champion of England twice; she was Women's Doubles champion eight times and Mixed Doubles champion five times. Her total of 15 national titles put her at No 5 on the all-time list of players winning titles at the English National Championships.

She represented England at five World Table Tennis Championships in the Corbillon Cup, from 1967 to 1975. She won an English Open Women's Doubles title with Mary Wright and also reached the quarter-finals of the English Open Women's Doubles with



Mary and the Mixed Doubles with Denis Neale in 1967.

She won a bronze medal in the team event at the European Table Tennis Championships in 1970. Karenza also won gold and silver medals in the Commonwealth Championships.

Led the development and implementation of the Charlie Childs





coaching bursary, which provides support for coaches looking to increase youth, women and girls and/or Disabled People's participation.

Since early 2020 has been a Co-opted member of the Table Tennis England Board's Talent and Performance Committee and is the inaugural Chair of the Athletes Panel.

Karl Bushell

For his service to Oxfordshire in administering and promoting the County Championships.

Karl started playing table tennis in 1965 at his local Boys' Club in Swindon and went on to become county champion in Wiltshire, Buckinghamshire and Oxfordshire, representing all counties.

As a junior won the Coca-Cola Open in 1970.

Moved to Oxfordshire in 1986 and has won numerous titles. Has represented Oxfordshire at Senior, Veterans and Over-60s on more than 275 occasions.

In his bank career, represented Barclays Bank at various European tournaments and has played at various European and World veterans' events.

BBC Oxfordshire Sports Personality of the Year in 2009.

Coaching - Level 2 coach.

Has been club coach at Kidlington Forum TTC since 1987, helping develop both junior and senior players plus coaching at various local schools and community events.

For many years attended at the Stoke



Mandeville complex on behalf of Table Tennis England to coach and administer the Spinal Injury Games, WheelPower events and LimbPower Games. Has also been a coach at SportAble in Maidenhead for the Southern area disability players and Special Olympic team players.

For her service to the membership of Table Tennis England.

Sandra Joined Table Tennis England in February 2014 as the National Coaching co-ordinator and is now the Membership and Systems Manager where she is responsible managing the customer service and membership department.

Sandra enjoys engaging with our members in providing help and advice and is always looking at ways on how to improve our customer service to the membership.

Sandra's background is in Learning and Development where she co-ordinated a wide range of talent and graduate programme events and projects along with ongoing design and development of the RICS Professional Accreditation (APC) programs.

In December 2022 Sandra and two Table Tennis England colleagues set up a local Bat & Chat Club which runs one evening a week, they have recently been awarded £1,000 by the Taylor Wimpey Community Chest competition after being nominated by the community for most deserving local group.



Will Bayley MBE, Fliss Pickard, Billy Shilton

For their achievements in becoming champions at the World Para Table Tennis Championships 2022.

Will Bayley won his first major title at the European Championships in 2011, then took silver in London 2012 and followed that by becoming World champion in 2014 and Paralympic champion in 2016.

He reclaimed the world No 1 ranking in men's class 7 after winning tournaments in Italy, Slovenia and Japan in 2019 and won the hearts of the nation as a contestant on BBC TV's Strictly Come Dancing.

He recovered from a serious knee injury to compete in Tokyo in 2021 and took silver in the men's class 7 singles and silver in the men's class 6-7 team event.

In 2022 he was unbeaten in singles as he regained both the world No 1 ranking and the world title, taking gold in the men's class 7 singles in Spain.

He was awarded the MBE in the 2016 New Year Honours.

Fliss Pickard started playing table tennis when she wanted to find a sport she could play competitively. Born with

cerebral palsy, dressage, boccia and swimming failed to provide her with the challenge but at the age of 14 she found a sport in which she could excel.

She made her international debut at the Czech Open in 2011 and was selected for the GB Para Table Tennis Team Performance Squad in April 2014.

Fliss made a breakthrough at the World Championships in 2018, taking bronze in the women's class 6 singles having earlier in the year represented Team England in the Commonwealth Games on the Gold Coast. Having just missed out on automatic qualification for the Paralympic Games in Tokyo, Fliss responded by taking gold in her next three international tournaments.

She represented Team England again in the Commonwealth Games in Birmingham and just missed out on bronze after losing 3-1 to the class 10 Nigerian Faith Obazuaye.

At the World Championships in Andalucia in 2022, Fliss combined with Grace Williams to take gold in the women's class 14 doubles and also took bronze in the mixed class 14 doubles with Billy Shilton.



Billy Shilton started playing table tennis in 2012, when his disability meant he could not play football an more.

His father took him to Woodchester table tennis club and he loved it.

His first big achievement was winning the UK School Games para event in 2015. He was then invited to train full time with the BPTT performance squad and live in Sheffield,

He won a bronze medal at the Tokyo 2020 Paralympic games in men's class 8 with team-mates Aaron McKibbin and Ross Wilson last year won the men's doubles class 14 at the World Championships with Paul Karabardak.

Johnny Leach MBE Most Improved England Player of the Year Award

For a player representing England

Ella Pashley

For showing the most improvement while representing England during 2022.

Ella is 14 years old and lives in Guisborough, Cleveland. She plays at Ormesby Table Tennis Club.

She is currently coached by Carole Moore and Alan Ransome and represents Ormesby in the Junior British League and the Women's British League.

Ella has represented England for the last two years at various WTT events and is part of the National training squad.

In the last 12 months, she has won three 4-star tournaments including Blackpool, Cambridge and Stockton. She has won a number of medals at the Swedish Tour events in the last 12 months, including one gold, two silvers and two bronze.

She won the Senior National qualifying tournament without losing a game and got to the quarter-finals of the U21 event at the Senior Nationals in March.

At the Cadet and Junior Nationals, she won the silver medal in the U17s, bronze in the Cadets and a gold medal



in the U17 doubles. She also won a bronze medal in the U16 age group at the Butterfly Schools Individual Competition.

She has most recently won the Cadet National Cup in Plymouth and qualified to play in the Junior National Cup.

She has been selected for the European Youth Championships for the second consecutive year and for the World Schools competition in Rio de Janeiro in August.

She has also recently received the Mike Watts Achievement Award as the female junior with the biggest rise in ranking points this season.
