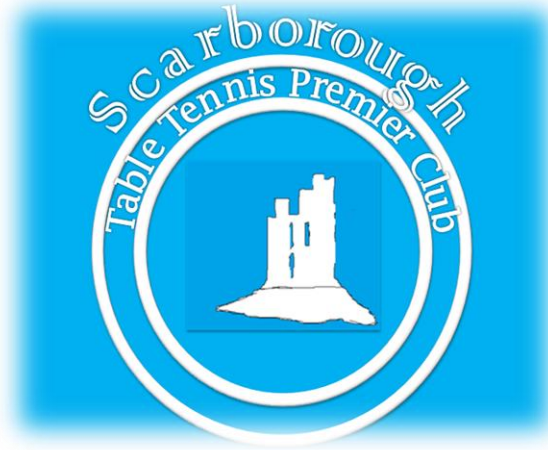

Tournament Regulations

1. Every entrant must be affiliated as a Compete Plus Member or provide proof of being a member of another National Association affiliated to the ITTF. An entrant who is not a TTE member or is affiliated as a Supporter or Club Play Member may alternately purchase a One-Off Tournament Pass at the time of entry via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> An entrant only affiliated as a Compete member may enter the tournament upon payment of the appropriate One-Time Tournament Top-Up fee via <https://tabletennisengland.sport80.com/> It is not possible to obtain the OTTP or the OTTT at the tournament.
2. TTE Regulations Part A (Regulated Competitions) and Part B (Tournament Regulations) apply to the tournament.
3. ITTF Regulations for International Competitions apply to the tournament except where otherwise specified in TTE Regulations Parts A or B, or in this form.
4. Completion and submission of this Entry Form signifies agreement by the entrant to the conditions of the competition, including any variations of ITTF regulations.
5. All competitors may be required to umpire at least one match in each event entered.
6. All matches shall be the best of five games to eleven points. Preliminary matches will be on a group basis. The final order in a group shall be determined as per ITTF regulation 3.7.5 for group competitions.
7. Players' Clothing: 2-Star & above, and Zonal & above: Playing clothing shall consist of a shirt and shorts, trousers, leggings or skirt, or a one-part sports outfit, socks and playing shoes; a sports hijab may also be worn. Other garments shall not be worn during play except with the permission of the referee. ITTF 3.2.2.1 amended. The main colour of a shirt, shorts, trousers or skirt, other than sleeves and collar of a shirt, shall be clearly different from that of the ball in use. ITTF 3.2.2.2 amended. Markings or trimming on the front or side of a playing garment and objects such as jewellery worn by a player shall not be so conspicuous or brightly reflecting as to unsight and opponent. ITTF 3.2.2.5.
8. No competitor or official shall engage in betting on players or matches.
9. Doping shall not take place either before or during play, doping control tests may take place.
10. All Competitors must report to the Booking-In Control on arrival and should not leave the hall without first obtaining permission from the Referee. Players absent when called upon to play are liable to be scratched.
11. The referee's decision shall be final on a point of law and on any question arising not provided for in these regulations, or in any dispute as to the interpretation thereof.
12. Players must have been born in 2006 or later for the junior events, 2008 or later for the Under 17 events, 2010 or later for the cadet events, 2012 or later for the under 13 events and 2014 or later for the under 11 events. Should there be insufficient entries in any event the Referee reserves the right to cancel that event/merge such event and/or place the entrant in a similar event.
13. Competitors may enter TWO events subject to eligibility (one am and one pm event).
14. If it becomes necessary to restrict entries, priority will be given in order of receipt.
15. All entries and event details are subject to COVID-related restrictions, or protocols that Table Tennis England may deem necessary. Venues used for events may impose COVID restrictions that go beyond government guidance.
16. All participants and attendees at Table Tennis England events are subject to Table Tennis England Codes of Conduct. Please see <https://www.tabletennisengland.co.uk/about-us/safeguarding/safeguarding-codes-of-conduct-and-terms-of-reference/>
17. TTE, the Organisers and the Referee will not tolerate bad language or verbal abuse of volunteers, officials, staff or venue staff, nor a failure to follow the operational directions of stewards and event staff. We will treat all such instances extremely seriously and will take disciplinary action if necessary. Entries – If it is necessary to restrict entries the last to be received will be rejected. Once the draw is made no refunds will be made. The draw will be made on 28th April 2025.

Playing conditions –

Courts: Each table is in an individual court enclosed by surrounds Court sizes are 9m x 4.5m Minimum height of playing area (floor to ceiling) 8m Minimum height of lighting from floor 7m.

Lighting: The venue has general LED lighting.

Floor: The floor is comprised of brick blocks.

Play will be on 8 Sponeta tables with Sponeta nets and posts. Balls will be Butterfly 3 Star 40+ white. Scoring machines will be used for all matches.

Car Parking: There is plenty of free parking at the venue.

Admission: There is no admission charge to the venue for players or spectators.

Refreshments – There will be light refreshments and drinks available throughout the day.

Showers – There are shower and changing facilities available.

Practice – There are no separate practice facilities, but practice is allowed on free tables at the Referee's discretion.

Ranking Scheme – All match results will be submitted for inclusion in the Table Tennis England Computer Ranking Scheme.

Prizes – Trophies or medals will be awarded to the winners and runners-up in each category.

PA System – Matches will be announced on the PA system. Players should stay within the centre when they are due to play.

Accommodation – There is a huge choice of places to stay in Scarborough. Advice can be given upon request.
