**ETTA Satellite Club Programme on track to achieve year one targets**

National target to establish 80 new ETTA operational satellites  
Each satellite is to operate for a minimum of 30 weeks for a minimum of 1 hour each week.  
Participation figures are a minimum of 25 (14-19 years of age) to attend each satellite within the first year (total -2000 satellite participants).

**To date we have 82 satellites planned with 34 satellites now in full operation. Over 500 participants have already been registered as attending a new table tennis satellite session.**

Delivery figures are yet to be released but early numbers from 23 football clubs reporting returns so far indicate:

- Number of Satellites: 74
- Participants Engaged: 1537 (219 females)
- Participants Retained: 580 (75 females)
- Participants Sustained: 59 (extremely small numbers as definition requires 'attendances over two terms' although it means some participants are still attending from last year)

## NATIONAL NETWORK MANAGER – KAREN KEECH

### Workplace Challenge

The County Sport Partnership Network (CSPN) has been successful in obtaining funding to rollout a national programme in partnership with national governing bodies of workplace activities and opportunities.

To co-ordinate the programme two officers have been recruited by the CSPN and based within the Sports Park at Loughborough University. The ETTA is working with the CSPN workplace officers to rollout Instant Ping Pong in a number of CSP areas. Initial thoughts have been sent to CSPN as to where they could target and these will be clarified by the new area leads.

A rag rating system was used to differentiate between the CSPs and when CSPs are finalised they will be distributed to all development staff. Each CSP that has been rag rated as amber will be sent a small number of IPP (Instant Ping Pong) bags and pointed towards the Instant Ping! Pong website and the ETTA website.

### Ping! 2014

Sport England has agreed for funding of £250,000 to be awarded to Sing London in 2014/15 to continue its delivery of Ping! Further investments of £250,000 in 2015/16 and 2016/17 have been earmarked for the project, with the intention that Ping! will be integrated into the ETTA's recreational table tennis strategy by 2015/16.

Ping! 2014 is proposed to be held at four new cities of Leeds (North), Nottingham (Central), Exeter (South West) and Milton Keynes (London / South East). There will be five legacy cities that ran Ping! 2013 with Ping! funding and these will be Oxford, Cambridge, Cornwall, Middlesbrough and London. The cities that were part of the Ping! programme but self funded by the ETTA or Ping Cities that have been previously legacy cities will be supported via the ETTA support package (being developed).

### Uni Ping! 2014 Pilot

The University Ping! pilot is currently underway with small grants applications submitted for the Pongathon University Challenge from Oxford Brookes, Sussex University, Gloucester University, and Hertfordshire University who should be receiving a response very soon. The table below shows which Universities are piloting Offer 1 and Pongathon University Challenge (offer 2).

#### Offer 1

Universities are supplied with three instant Ping Pong kits, electronic resources, monitoring and evaluation forms (electronically and in hard copy), logo, etc and promotional poster templates, etc. Training is being organised for the Ping! activator (job description, advert etc provided) and will be disseminated to all the respective staff and university contacts.

#### Offer 2

Universities are supplied with a template small grants application that can be amended and submitted to obtain a grant for Pongathon delivering a social programme at the university including "Pongathon nights" and a social league with accompanying IT resource, etc.

### VOLUNTEERING, DIVERSITY AND CHILD PROTECTION – JUDY ROGERS

#### Safeguarding

- Following on from the October report three of the five cases have been resolved and two memberships and have been reinstated although in one case the coach license has been withheld. One of the cases the person has been rearrested following another incident not sport related so we are awaiting the outcome of that investigation which does involve a safeguarding issue. A further case has also been reported during December in which an investigation is underway.
- I am currently looking at producing a policy and guidelines for using social media linked to an updated photographic policy.

- Over the past six months I have been part of a working party that has been looking at parental behaviour in sport and the positive and negative impacts that can have on young participants. As a result a short film clip (five mins) has been produced highlighting some of the issues which I am using as part of a 30 minute workshop aimed at parents which is going to be piloted in the South West within the next two months and will then be delivered in the other three talent centres.

### **Disability**

- The number of Ability Clubs is 72 currently with an additional one club in the process.
- Patrick Cox and Adam Thompson competed as the GB team in the INAS World Championships (Learning Disability) where Adam won a bronze medal. Thanks must go to Shaun Newcomb (Team Manager) and Chris Turner (Team Coach), Cathay Pacific for providing free travel and UKSA (UK Sports Association for People with Learning Disabilities) for their support.
- 31<sup>st</sup> May and 1<sup>st</sup> June 2014 will see the first Disabled Grand Prix to be held in Scotland at the Drumchapel Table Tennis Club. It will be preceded on the Friday evening with the first ever disabled Home International which myself and Terry McLernon MBE have been working towards over the past two years and it is great to see the event taking place. The Grand Prix will also form part of the selection for the Sainsbury's School Games.

### **Sainsburys School Games**

- The 2014 Games will be held in Manchester from 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> September and will include a disability event.

### **Partnerships**

I have been continuing to work closely with all the partnership agencies and attended conferences and forums run by CPSU (Child Protection in Sport Unit), Sport England, EFDS (English Federation of Disability Sport), Sporting Equals and WSFF (Women's Sport and Fitness Foundation).

### **Jack Petchey Foundation - Schools' Table Tennis Donation Scheme**

The Jack Petchey Foundation has recently confirmed a fourth year of funding for the London Schools Table Tennis programme, with an award of £173,472. This builds on the programme which has delivered table tennis within 200 schools and created regular playing opportunities for over 6000 young people.

Five London Table Tennis Academy schools have now been identified, each will receive 10 tables and will become a focus for school table tennis in the area, hosting inter school competition, coaching and leadership courses and establishing after school community clubs

The third JPF London Team finals were held at the University of East London on Saturday 18<sup>th</sup> January in two halls with a record number of teams and nearly 200 competitors competing on a record 38 tables. Full details and photos can be seen at:

### **Table Tennis Networker and Young Officials Awards**

There were a record 67 courses delivered to 926 candidates in 2012-13, and numbers looks set to continue with 34 courses and 525 candidates booked up to the end of January 2014.

Courses are increasingly being delivered by schools as part of the PE curriculum. There is still the offer of one free course per PremierClub per year with the aim of increasing the number of young players becoming newly qualified umpires.

Each County Sport Partnership can also access a free course to support the training of young officials to assist at the Level 3 School Games. Details are available from the new area teams.

### **SGO Conference**

The ETTA held a joint stand with ESTTA at the School Games Organiser Network National Summit held in Kettering on 15<sup>th</sup> October, with all 450 SGOs from across England coming together for a day of sharing best practice and future thinking. The stand was a great success with huge interest in table tennis resources such as Instant Ping, Butterfly schools league programme and ETTA ladder board.

### **Sainsbury's 2014 School Games – Manchester**

Table Tennis has been included as one of 12 sports for the 2014 School Games for the ninth year in a row. These Games are being held in Manchester on 4<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> September, with initial operation group meetings due to commence in January. There will be a new event delivery partner on board for the Games this year instead of FastTrack.

### **School Games**

Filming for the Inclusive Table Tennis resource took place in November and is currently being edited. The video and the resource cards will be available in time for the YST conference in Telford on 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> February.
