



## Table Tennis England Selection Policy

V1.1

The European Table Tennis Championships are taking place on 15-20 September 2020 in Warsaw, Poland.

### 1. Event Purpose

Table Tennis England will select players to this event in order to achieve the following objective:

- a. To secure a quarter final finish or better in either singles or doubles.
- b. To secure ranking points in support of Olympic qualification
- c. To support the development of young players with a rising ITTF profile
- d. To enable players to be eligible for attendance at the 2021 ITTF World Championships (Individual)

### 2. Eligibility

Table Tennis England will only consider athletes for selection who comply with the Table Tennis England Major Championships Eligibility Policy 2020.

### 3. Scope of the Team

Table Tennis England may select up to the maximum number of players for in each event through the following selection process:

Players will first be selected under the automatic criteria (4a) and if spaces remain additional players may be added under the wildcard (4b) criteria up to the maximum entry if the wildcard panel feel that players of sufficient quality are available for selection.

### 4. Criteria

Selection can be achieved either automatically or as a wild card by the Selection Panel, as follows:

#### a) Automatic Selection

Eligible athletes will gain automatic selection, subject to compliance with the rest of this policy, if they meet one or more of the following singles criteria:

1. Top 100 ITTF senior singles ranking (for two months or more in the qualification period)

2. Last 16 of any World Tour events in the qualification period in singles.
3. Top 32 ITTF senior doubles ranking (for two months or more in the qualification period)
4. Last 16 of any World Tour events in the qualification period in doubles

In the event there are more automatic selections than places, places will be offered in the following way:

1. Order: places will be offered in the order listed above until the maximum number of singles entries is completed.
2. Should one criteria have more players than places, then the places will be offered in ranking order on the most recent list.

If players meet the automatic criteria in singles, they will be entered into singles and doubles and or mixed doubles if places are available. If they qualify just in doubles or mixed doubles, then they will only be entered into the singles event if spaces are available and they are selected under 4b.

#### **b) Wild Card Selection**

If there are still places available after Automatic Selections have been accommodated the selection panel may choose to select up to the number of spaces available as set out in Scope of the Team. The panel may choose any eligible players and are not required to consider any particular set of factors or information they may select any player(s) who they believe may contribute to the overall objectives of the competition or the objectives of Table Tennis England. The panel are not required to provide reasons or rationale for their selections and no appeals for non selection under this part of the criteria will be accepted.

For the avoidance of doubt the selection panel is not required to select any singles Wild Cards but may choose to do so if space is available.

## **5. Medical**

At the time of their selection, any selected athlete may have their medical and/or musculoskeletal status confirmed by a nominated Table Tennis England Medical adviser. Any selected athlete may, at any other time, be required by the Director of Sport (and/or his delegate) to undergo fitness or medical assessments to ensure that they have maintained an adequate level of fitness to perform to the best of their ability. The Director of Sport (and/or his delegate) will specify the process by which a selected athlete is to confirm his or her continued health and fitness, which might include participating in certain events or undergoing fitness tests.

## 7. Wild Card Selection Panel

A selection panel will be established comprising:

- a) Table Tennis England Director of Sport (Chair)
- b) Table Tennis England Technical Director
- c) Table Tennis England National Men's Coach (for male selections)
- d) Table Tennis England Women's Captain (for female selections)
- e) Athlete Selection Advisor (Non voting)

In the event of a split-decision, the Chair will have the casting vote. Additional experts may be asked to provide evidence and/or advice to the selection committee, at the request of the Chair

In the event of any conflict of interest for any member, the Table Tennis England conflict of interest policy should be adhered to. Any member with a conflict of interest shall not be entitled to vote on that issue.

## 8. Media & Communication

All selected athletes are required to adhere to the Social Media guidance which can be found on the Table Tennis England website at the following address:

All athletes, whether selected or not are required to keep the notification of their selection or non-selection confidential until directed by the Table Tennis England.

## 9. De-Selection

Table Tennis England retains the right to deselect any selected athlete under any of the following circumstances (whether automatic or wild card selection):

- i. The player is no longer eligible for selection for this event;
- ii. The player does not adhere to the code of conduct or team members agreement;
- iii. The player in the sole opinion of the Wildcard Selection Panel, is no longer physically or mentally able to perform at the level consistent with that which earned their initial selection;
- iv. The player fails to comply with any reasonable training or competition programme set out by Table Tennis England performance staff;
- v. Any exceptional circumstances exist which in the reasonable opinion of the Selection Panel justify the non-selection or de-selection of the athlete concerned.

Any player who is de-selected will immediately be notified of the decision and the reason. They will have a right of appeal in accordance with the appeals process.

## 10. Appeals

Eligible players only have the right to appeal in the following cases:

- i. The automatic selection criteria were not applied correctly;
- ii. A player was de-selected under Point 9 above
- iii. An ineligible player was selected under any point

No appeals will be considered in the following cases:

- i. Wild Card Selections save for ineligibility;
